PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW (max. 5 sentences)

This course deals with origin, content, and contemporary development of norms governing international **turn-over** of goods, services and money in International Trade Law, for the purpose of gaining scientific competences and academic skills, developing creative capacities and learning practical skills in this area of law. The course also encompasses analysis of legal and political origin of International Trade Law norms and its relationship with the aims of these norms. This approach enables students to become competent to apply and interpret norms and principles underlying International Trade Law.
