PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW (max. 5 sentences)

This course covers research of origin, content, and contemporary development of norms governing international turn-over of goods, services and money, for the purpose of gaining scientific competences and academic skills, develop creative thinking skills and learning practical skills in International Trade Law.
